

Drug Incident Actions

In the event of a drug use incident or where a student requires intervention for a drug use issue our incident management and intervention support processes will be followed.

In summary:

- The safety of students and staff is given priority.
- Parents/carers and administration staff will be informed by appropriate personnel.
- The principal will consider notifying police if illicit drug use is suspected.
- Both student(s) and parent/ carer(s) will be offered support through appropriate interventions.
- The incident and/or issue will be documented and relevant agencies involved.
- Respect will be given to the privacy and confidentiality by and for all parties involved.



What is a drug?

A drug is a substance, not including food and water, which when introduced to the body can change the physical, psychological and/or emotional state.

Examples of drugs include: caffeine, tobacco, panadol, alcohol, cough medicine and marijuana.

What are we doing at Broome Senior High School about drugs?

Teaching drug education across all year levels.
Professional development and training of staff
Whole community involvement in health and drug education programs
Talking about health and drug education with students and families
Inviting other agencies into our school to help educate our students about drugs

School Drug Education

Is providing information, support, and developing skills which aim to reduce students' risk of harm from drug use.

Broome Senior High School does not permit students on school premises or at any school event to consume, possess or be affected by:

> alcohol psychoactive substances pharmaceutical drugs for non-medicinal purposes volatile substances illicit drugs

Furthermore, students are not permitted to:

possess and/or use drugrelated equipment, unless intended for legitimate medicinal use Promote or advertise drug use or products (eg: on clothing, drawings)



Care Givers and Visitors

The use and supply of drugs by students, parents, staff, carers and visitors is not permitted on the school site, or during any educational activity outside the school grounds.

Medicine

If a student is on regular medication that will need to be taken at school, the school must be notified through the Year Leader.
