Concerns reviewed by the WA Education Department


You may have recently learned, a new artificial intelligence application called ChatGPT is being used by some students to create content for assessments and assignments as part of their schoolwork

2023 Financial (Secondary) Assistance Scheme

To assist families with the payment of contributions and charges, the Department of Education offers financial assistance to parents and guardians who are holders of a Centrelink Health Care Card, Centrelink Pensioner Concession Card or a Veterans' Affairs Pensioner Concession Card.

EDUCATION PROGRAM ALLOWANCE

\$235 is paid to the school towards the student's contributions and charges and applicants receive a further \$115 clothing allowance which they can elect to receive or have paid directly to the school to further assist them with school costs. Please note families who have applied for Abstudy are not eligible to apply for this allowance.

ABSTUDY SUPPLEMENT ALLOWANCE

A supplement amount of \$79 is available to families who have already received the Abstudy school allowance of either \$78 or \$156 from Centrelink.

Application forms for both allowances are available from the Broome Senior High School administration office and please note applications close on Thursday 6 April 2023.

Attend today and achieve tomorrow

Missing school means your child misses out on vital information and maintaining learning routines. This can result in a loss of confidence and missing out on forming vital friendships.

Attendance is recorded each day. As a parent or caregiver you are responsible for ensuring your child attends school every day, including sports days unless your child:

- has an unavoidable medical or dental appointment (preferably these should be made after school or during holidays)
- · is required to attend a recognised religious holiday
- is required to attend an exceptional or urgent family circumstance (such as attending a funeral)
- · is sick, or has an infectious illness.

If you are having difficulty getting your child to attend school regularly, you might like to talk to the school Principal or the school Student Services team.

If your child has to be absent from school for any reason, including arriving late or leaving early, please contact the school on 9195 3100, or explain the reason by email as soon as possible.





School-based immunisation program for 2023: what to expect.

The School-based Immunisation Program provides routine and recommended vaccines to WA high school students for free.

Students are eligible to receive the following vaccines in 2023:

- Year 7: Diptheria-tetanus-pertussis (dTpa) and Human papillomavirus (HPV)
- Year 10: Meningococcal ACWY (Men ACWY)

In the coming weeks:

- our school nurse will provide a talk to students on the vaccinations
- consent forms will be sent out and must be completed even if the student is not having the vaccination.
- · dates will be set for the vaccinations
- our school nurse will come to the school to administer them.
- follow-up vaccinations will be done throughout the year on students who may not be at school on the set date.

Immunisation records

Following vaccination, students will receive a record of the vaccines they have received. All vaccines administered through the school-based program are recorded in the Australian Immunisation Register (AIR). You can access your child's Immunisation History Statements from the AIR to check their vaccinations are up to date.

Parents and guardians can consent on the VaccinateWA website.

Otherwise a hard copy form can be requested from school.

Consent is required before the immunisation program starts in Term 1.
