

The power of resilience is the ability to bounce back after facing challenges and tough times. Resilient children not only recover from adversity but also navigate challenges such as moving house, starting school, facing bullying, dealing with academic difficulties, family breakdowns, illness or loss.

When children deal well with problems, they enhance their skills and confidence, equipping them to approach and resolve future issues. Resilience teaches them that feelings of anxiety, sadness, disappointment, fear or frustration are temporary and they can weather these emotions, knowing they will be okay. This emotional intelligence discourages unhealthy coping mechanisms like anger, violence or self-harm.

Nurturing resilience is a gradual process, requiring patience and support as your child learns to tackle challenges independently. While the instinct to make everything right is strong, allowing children to navigate difficult emotions helps them develop resilience. The foundation of resilient children lies in warm, supportive and strong relationships with family and caregivers. Positive connections foster feelings of love, safety, security, confidence and value.

- Support your child but try not to solve every little problem or disappointment eg if your child doesn't get what they want, talk to them about how they're feeling instead of trying to fix the problem.
- Help your child to identify and manage strong emotions eg your child might be worried about someone who's sick. You could say, 'I can see you're really worried about Grandpa. It's OK to be worried. Remember we're doing everything we can to help him get better'.
- Develop problem-solving skills eg if a child at school is unkind to your child, talk to them about different ways they could respond next time
- A positive role model who has experienced similar challenges, may help your child
- Notice and talk about things that are going well eg at dinner time you could each share one good thing about your day.
- Allow your child to experience challenges. This might mean letting your child make mistakes or not replacing a broken toy. Dealing with small challenges builds resilience to deal with bigger challenges.
- Encourage your child to have another go when things don't work out. Praise your child for trying. You could say 'I'm proud of you for finishing the race' or 'Well done for giving it another go'.
