2020 FINANCIAL (SECONDARY) ASSISTANCE SCHEME

(Applications close 9 April 2020)

To assist families with the payment of *Contributions and Charges*, the Department of Education offers financial assistance to parents and guardians who are holders of a

Centrelink Family Health Care Card,
Centrelink Pensioner Concession Card or
a Veterans' Affairs Pensioner Concession Card.

EDUCATION PROGRAM ALLOWANCE

\$235 is paid to the school towards the student's contributions and charges and applicants receive a further \$115 clothing allowance which they can elect to receive or have paid directly to the school to further assist them with school costs. Please note families who have applied for Abstudy are not eligible to apply for this allowance.

ABSTUDY SUPPLEMENT ALLOWANCE

A supplement amount of \$79 is available to families who have already received the Abstudy school allowance of either \$78 or \$156 from Centrelink.

Application forms for both allowances are available from the administration office and please note applications close on Thursday 9 April 2020.
