


#### FORCE-d to learn in Science

# **Bushranger Cadet Camp to Dampier 2020**

This term the Bushranger Cadets enjoyed a week-long stay at The Dampier Camp School in the Pilbara. Our journey started when we finalised preparations in the morning at school, then set off in a car convoy to Dampier.

On the way there we camped in tents at Eighty Mile Beach Caravan Park and Black Rock Caravan Park in Port Hedland and then at Pardoo on the way home. The students enjoyed a fun week participating in archery, canoeing, team building activities, a shipwreck challenge, scavenger hunt and the highlight was a visit to Sam's Island off the coast of Dampier.

Throughout the journey, we conducted testing for the 'Eye-on-Water' program for CSIRO to evaluate water health and conducted marine debris audits for Tangaroah Blue to assist in the collection of data to stop the flow of litter from its source. Observations were also made for Dolphin Watch, to provide data of Bottlenose dolphin movements.

A lot of fun was had by all.

Here at school we have a PBS mug that is passed on each week to staff members that lead the way with PBS and do amazing stuff every day.




Those that have received the PBS mug so far are:
