

Year 12 class of 2023: A bright future awaits



It is fantastic to see some of our students thriving at the Maindim Yangbala or 'minding young fella', a comprehensive educational and vocational program for Broome's youth, fostering skill development and overall well-being. The intiative offers students opportunities to do their First Aid Training, White Card certification and other enriching on-country experiences. Beyond education, the program provides wrap-around support for a successful return to school. Tailored case management plans cater to each student's unique needs. Alongside technical skills, Maindim Yangbala emphasizes financial literacy, healthy eating and mental health support.

Under the guidance of an Apprentice Master and support from experienced youth workers and education officers, students have been busy building electric scooters and engaging in meaningful on-country experiences. This program unlocks recreational and vocational opportunities, empowering young individuals to make positive life choices.

Funded by the Australian Government's Safer Communities Fund – Early Intervention initiative, Maindim Yangbala is a collaborative effort between The Skill Engineer Ltd and the Broome Youth and Families Hub. Its mission is to uplift and empower Broome's youth, equipping them with the skills, support and opportunities they need to thrive.
